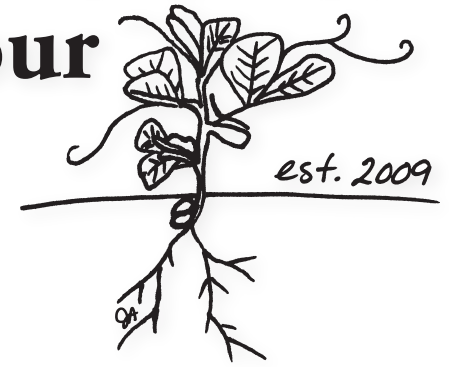


# Lawrence Food Garden Tour

## 1 The Not-So-Secret Garden – 506 Walnut, walk around back or accessible from the levee.

A garden using permaculture techniques, this space was created by the experiences of two herbal medicine apprentices with several years of farm work experience.



## 2 Garden Incubator – 200 N. 7<sup>th</sup> St., behind Ballard Center in North Lawrence. A community and kids' discovery garden, including a veggie maze, flower swirl, sensory plants, and grass mounds. Kids are encouraged to eat food straight off the plant.



## 3 Mike Riehm's Fruit/Veggie Garden – 1002 Pennsylvania, enter from gate south of house. The oldest garden on the tour (20 years) has been home to many chickens that have enriched the soil.



## 4 Hacienda del Hosta – 1119 New Jersey. Beautiful, with kid friendly spaces and places for chickens to roam. Garlic is a favorite with 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the garden devoted to it.



## 5 Cosmic Beauty School – 1145 Pennsylvania. This community garden, in its third year, spent two years investing in soil remediation. This first crop year will include several annual vegetables and medicinals.



## 6 Gratitude Garden – 1224 Delaware St. Lasagna gardening turned this lawn into a garden with goji berries, kiwi, and grapes. (1 of 3 at Delaware St. Commons.)



## 7 Delaware St. Commons Cohousing Neighborhood – 818 East 13<sup>th</sup> St. (AM only) A 2.2 acre community garden of 4 years with edible landscaping, chickens, and grape vines.



## 8 Fish in a Barrel Garden – 1218 Delaware St. #2 This 1 year old small scale "barrelponics" system/garden grows leafy greens and fish. (1 of 3 at Delaware St. Commons.)



## 9 Penn St. Gardens – 1313 Pennsylvania St. A first-year community garden through the City's Common Ground program, this group is converting a vacant lot into a vegetable garden.



## 10 Four Winds Native Center Community Garden – 1423 Haskell Ave. A community garden that serves the low-income Native and non-Native community of Lawrence.



## 11 Bob & Kirsten's Own Eden – 1801 Barker. This garden is grown using permaculture techniques in shady spaces with the accompaniment of backyard chickens.



## 12 Pine Tree Cooperative Townhouses – 149 Pinecone Dr., just past 2<sup>nd</sup> right. This 3 year old garden grows healthy plants and builds a strong community spirit.



## 13 Edible Landscaping – 2808 Harper St. Next to Mary's Lake, this beautiful garden uses permaculture techniques to amend soil and low tunnels to extend the growing season.



## 14 Hales' Kitchen Garden – 2728 Maverick Ln. This established garden grows several perennial herbs and plants, hops, and Hopi Pink Flour Corn.



## 15 Vancils' Edibles – 3116 W 23<sup>rd</sup> Terr. A 2 year old garden featuring square foot gardening in raised beds, several types of berries, and a butterfly garden.



## 16 Don's Four Season Garden – 2604 Jordan Ln. Four Season gardening is possible in this 8 year old garden featuring dwarf fruit trees and berries.



## 17 ALL-N-1 Landscape/Nitz Garden – 2212 Riviera Dr. A new family garden located near the community pool grows many vegetables and perennial plants.



## 18 ALL-N-1 Landscape/Zell Garden – 916 Prescott Dr. This front yard permaculture garden and social space includes a peaceful fountain, secluded seating, and edibles throughout.



## 19 Growing Food Growing Health Garden at West Middle School – 2700 Harvard Rd. (AM only) Growing produce for the school's cafeteria.



## 20 Lawrence Community Garden Project – Mississippi St. between 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>. This community garden features vegetables and ideas for the novice gardener.



## 21 Sunfire Meandering Garden – 1632 Alabama St. Featuring ceramic yard art from Sunfire Ceramics, young fruit trees, berry bushes, and a new potted garden area.
